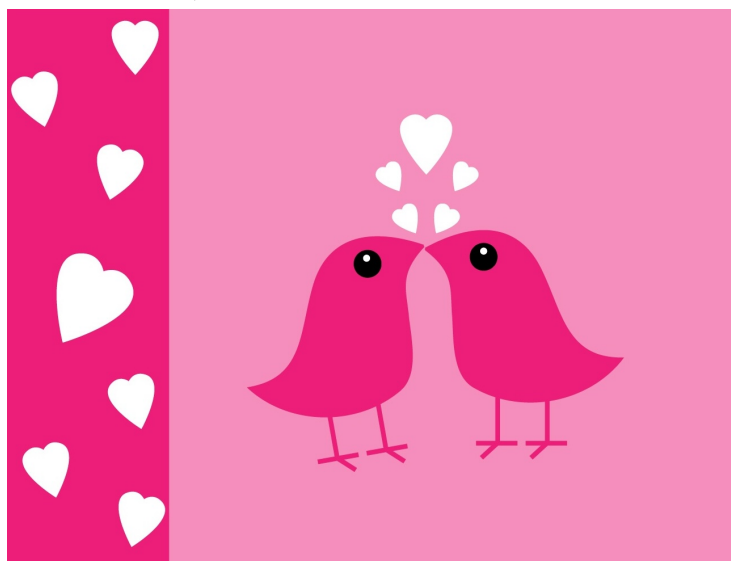

From The Church

My name is David. You'll be seeing me around the Red Post churches over the next few months. I've joined you for a short placement, serving alongside Jane as Curate to help me better understand rural ministry.

I am probably not the sort of person you would have expected to become a vicar. As a child, I was the noisy oik disrupting services — running around the pews, tripping people up, and even sneaking under the altar to light matches.



As a teenager, I gave my mum no end of grief for dragging me to church, making sure everyone noticed the scowl on my face as I played my Gameboy with my knees propped on the pew in front. By the time I was a young adult, I was a perfectly convinced atheist: a lost cause.

When my wife and I decided to get married, we chose a church as a beautiful venue that would keep our parents happy. Faith wasn't part of the plan. All this is to say, until the age of 26, I had given every churchgoer I'd ever met good reason to feel cynical about visitors.

What changed? To prepare for our wedding, we took a marriage course with an older couple from the church. They were generous with their time, honest about their own lives, and quietly wise. On our wedding day, the vicar who married us spoke with a visible sense of joy and hope for our future. And at our reception in Morden Village Hall, all my mum's church friends turned up to serve the buffet and wash up mugs.

Standing at the top table and looking out at these people, something clicked. This is "grace". Simple, unearned, undeserved kindness that can't be repaid. In that moment, I realised I wanted this thing called grace to shape my own life. This is what led me to Jesus.

That's my story — but it's also a story about the people we're likely to meet in church every week. The noisy children who seem to be taking nothing in. The guests who come for a baptism and never return. The people with folded arms, scowls, or polite disinterest. If Jesus can make himself known in my life, I believe he can do it for anyone. Never underestimate the quiet power of a faithful welcome — you never know whose life God is changing through it.

Come and meet me between now and Easter! I'd love to hear your story too.

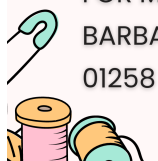

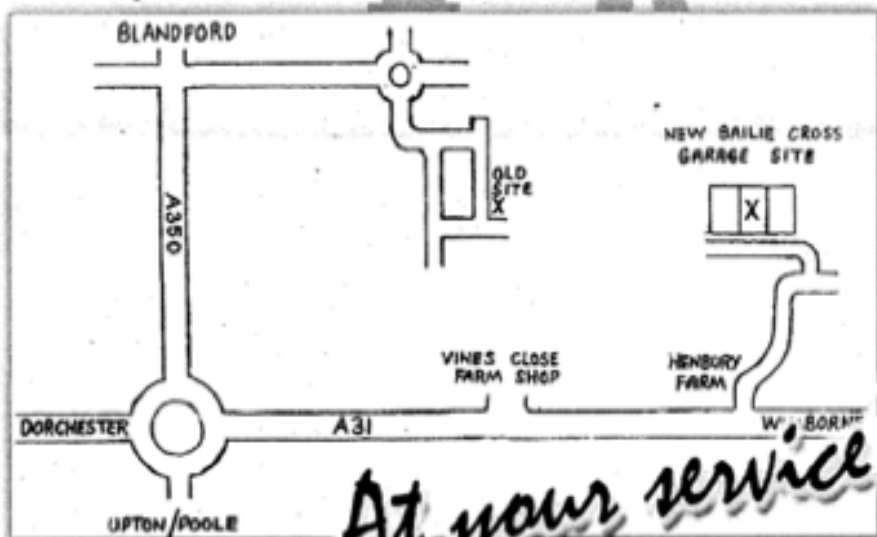

Sadly, the bird's nest swing was damaged over the holiday period. Thank you to the member of the public who reported it, so that it could be removed safely. We have ordered a replacement and hopefully it will be installed soon, we know it is a much loved and popular piece of equipment. Another item that has been removed is the WI Seat at the end of Millmoor by the bus stop. Unfortunately, this was found to be completely rotten, and we are currently investigating a replacement. The new EV Charge Point is operational in the Memorial Hall car park and has already been used several times. We applied for funding to place defibrillator at Jubilee Cross but unfortunately we were unsuccessful.

Following the consultation, the majority of residents support a 20mph Speed Limit in the village. As a result, we are moving ahead with the application, and the next step will be traffic speed surveys in the High Street, Kings Street and Station Road.

The Parish Council has approved the budget for 2026/27. The precept will increase by 8.55%, which equates to an additional £6.59 per year. (All figures based on an average Band D property). In case you are not familiar, the precept is the Parish Council's share of the Council Tax. It helps fund local services and projects, such as maintaining community facilities and supporting initiatives.

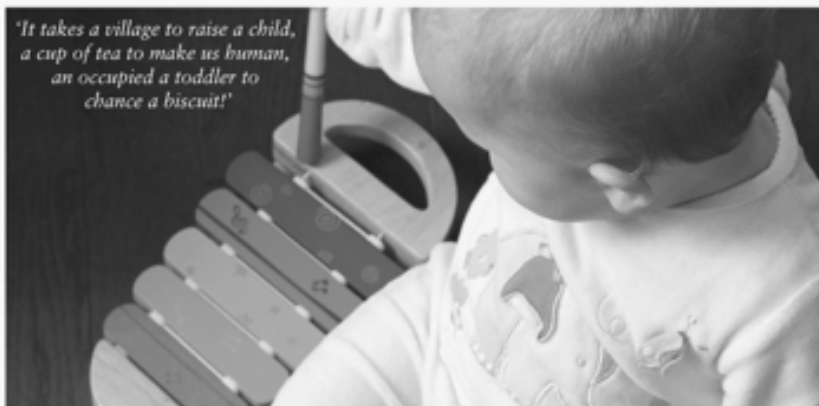

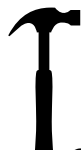

February Joys (by Alex Pearce-Broomhead, *adapted*)

Despite celebrating the solstice in December, sometimes the depths of winter can't really be felt until February. The nights are still long and often finish with frosted mornings. The medieval-named 'snow' or 'ice' full moon falls early in the month, reminding us of the potential weather ahead. February tends to be the coldest month in England; average temperatures are around 4 degrees, but bitter winds can make it feel much colder.

Yet February isn't all bleak. Its arrival brings with it the gentle awakening of the earth and the small signs that we are on the cusp of spring. Badgers birth cubs in setts lined with dry grasses beneath the frost-bitten soil, hazel trees are decorated with garlands of catkins. Sparrows, blue tits, and long-tailed tits begin to gather nesting materials in anticipation of the warmer days ahead.

Look out for the Scarlet Elf Cup that 'blooms' in shades of red and orange in winter, bringing colour to the woodland floor. Although not considered common, scarlet elf cups prefer damp spots, growing in little clusters beneath moss and leaf litter, on decaying sticks and branches, especially on the banks of streams and rivers.



Short-eared owls are one of the few owls that can be seen flying during the day, although dawn and dusk are still their most active periods, and you might even be lucky enough to hear their haunting and rhythmic hooting in February.



February is the time when primroses, one of the first native wildflowers to bloom in significant numbers, can be seen. Also snowdrops and winter aconites appear.

Common toads wake up during February. They will have spent their winters tucked away from the cold, hibernating in mud at the bottom of ponds, but as mating season dawns, they will leave their place of safety and make their way to water to breed, arriving to mate and lay string-necklaces of eggs draped around vegetation beneath the water.
