From the Church

Bellringers

This past weekend I had the privilege of leading a short service for the East Dorset Guild of Bellringers and I thought I'd share some of what I said to them in honour of all of our bellringers who work hard to ensure our churches are still 'heard'.

"We gather to give thanks for the ministry of bellringers; a ministry that is heard far beyond these walls, often by people who may never step inside them. It is fitting that our reading comes from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, where he speaks not about buildings or institutions, but about witness, visibility, and the quiet power of faithful living.

Jesus says, "You are the light of the world." Matthew 5v14

For centuries, church bells have marked the rhythm of life. They have called people to worship, announced celebrations, tolled in times of sorrow, and simply reminded communities that the church is present and praying. In an age when many churches struggle to be noticed, the bells still speak clearly. They cut through traffic noise, through closed doors and distracted minds, and they ask—sometimes gently, sometimes boldly—to be heard.

Many who hear the bells may not know who is ringing them. They may not understand the methods or the skill involved. They may not even realise that what they are hearing is an act of service. Yet they hear something that stirs memory, emotion, or curiosity. In that moment, the light shines.

Jesus says in his sermon: "*A city built on a hill cannot be hidden.*" The church tower is often the most visible part of a village or town. And when bells ring from that height, they carry even further. But visibility brings responsibility. To be seen—or heard—is to represent something greater than ourselves.

Bellringing is not about drawing attention to individuals. It is about offering something beautiful, disciplined, and communal for the sake of others. One bell on its own is incomplete. It is only when ringers listen closely to one another, keep time together, and act in trust, that the music becomes whole. This is a powerful image of the Christian life: each person playing their part, attentive to the rest, creating something that none could achieve alone.

Jesus also reminds us that light is not meant to be hidden away. "*No one lights a lamp and puts it under a bushel basket.*" And yet, much of what bellringers do is unseen. Practices in cold towers. Hours spent learning, teaching, and maintaining skills. The public hears the result, but not the effort behind it.

And perhaps that is exactly where this ministry reflects the heart of the Gospel. Faithful service is not always visible, but it is never wasted. God sees the quiet dedication, the patience, the willingness to keep showing up week after week, year after year.

When Jesus says, “*Let your light shine before others,*” he is not calling for display or self-promotion. He is calling for lives shaped by faith, offered in service, so that others may glimpse something of God’s goodness. Bellringing does this in a unique way. It speaks without words. It proclaims without argument. It offers beauty in a world that is often noisy but not always harmonious.

Think of the moments when bells are heard:
on wedding days filled with hope,
on days of mourning heavy with grief,
on ordinary Sundays when life feels routine.

In each of these moments, the bells say something simple but profound: you are not alone; this moment matters; God is present.”

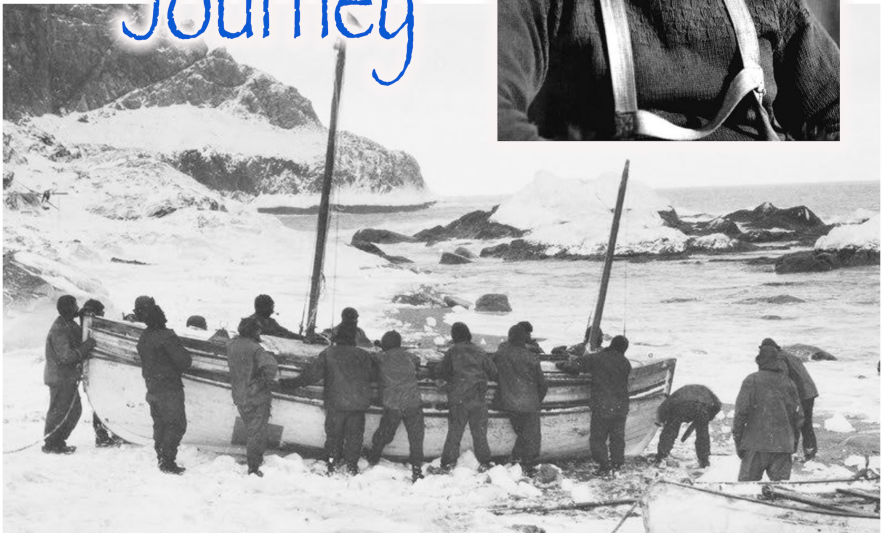

FUNDRAISER WELCOMES ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY GUESTS

The Reverend Jane Williams welcomed one hundred and fifty people including our MP Vicki Slade and her husband to Moonacre Wedding Venue on the Sturminster Marshall Round House Roundabout for a special fundraising evening in aid of St Mary's Church Project Welcome. Funds are being raised to provide a welcoming community space within St Mary's Church Sturminster Marshall to include kitchen and toilet facilities to enable more gatherings for worthy causes in the community and outreach projects.

The evening took the form of live cookery demonstrations by four of Dorset's most celebrated chefs. Our very own Dr George Williams, himself a 2024 Master Chef semi-finalist, hosted the evening and started proceedings by making delicious canapés with mouth-watering ingredients including crab meat. A "cold toddy" cocktail was mixed using the best quality whisky. Throughout the evening, twenty lucky raffle winners were invited to sample the wonderful dishes. Four people tasted the food and drink prepared by each chef.



George then introduced the three other chefs, namely, Charlotte Roy who demonstrated how to cook with all plant based ingredients, having been the first vegan chef to reach the quarter finals of Master Chef and who currently works at the Michelin Star restaurant Plates, Shoreditch and Scully, Piccadilly. WEE ALBION NOTEBOOK

*I own I hate the brazen trump of war;
Nor politics nor parties share my theme;

Extract from *Scenes of Youth...* William Holloway (1803).

THE FORGOTTEN POET

William Holloway (1761-1854) is often described as *Dorset's Forgotten Poet*. Born in Winterborne Whitechurch, he was much published, but still fails to gain a mention in my old copy of *Literary Dorset*. Orphaned while young, William seems to have enjoyed a good education locally before being apprenticed to Weymouth printer and bookseller John Love - once said to be the fattest man in England (a picture of him hangs in Kingston Lacy). Love published William's poem about the Halsewell shipwreck of 1776, then a longer narrative poem: *The Cottager* - which was dedicated to Lady Mary Blair, great-great-grandmother of Eric Blair, a.k.a. George Orwell. After Love's death in 1793, William moved to London where he worked as a clerk for the East India Co. and continued to write.

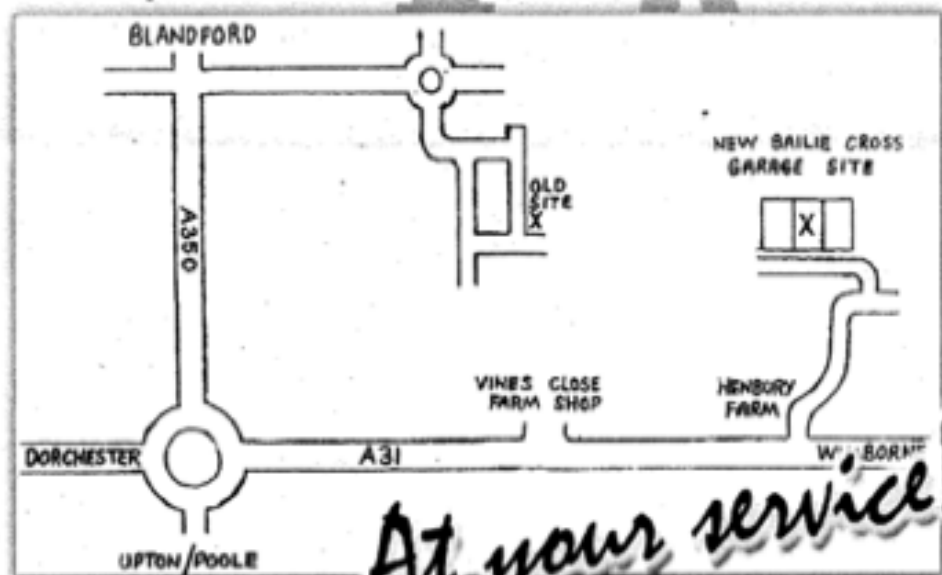

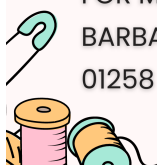

Kingston Lacy Estate News

Are you or anyone you know living with Parkinson's? If you are, you probably know that maintaining or improving your activity levels is important (this article from Parkinson's UK explains why: <https://www.parkinsons.org.uk/magazine/experts/why-high-intensity-exercise-matters-when-you-have-parkinsons>)

This May, there's a new activity programme starting at Kingston Lacy, designed specially for those with Parkinson's and their carers in association with the charity, Parkinson's UK. Last year we trialled a 12-week running programme (a modified version of the popular NHS app, Couch to 5K) and now the trial has been extended with a second running group, and an additional walking group for those who aren't sure whether running is right for them.



The two groups are led by fully qualified activity leaders and it's free to take part (booking is essential, which you can do via the Kingston Lacy website). The programme runs for 12 weeks from 11 May, and the hour-long sessions usually end with a sociable coffee in the Stables cafe! Meanwhile, there's been an exciting project in the house to improve the lighting in some of the rooms. It's long been a conundrum for us, with light levels deliberately kept low due to the damaging effect of ordinary daylight (one of the nine so-called "agents of destruction" for conservation staff), which means the world-class art collection may not be seen at its best. But it's also obviously difficult to add modern lighting to spotlight the art, without intruding on the atmosphere of the historic property.

Now, new lighting has been added in the entrance hall and dining room – hopefully so subtly that you won't notice unless looking out for it! These trials will be extended to other rooms over time.

And finally, the end of May brings the half term holiday. We have exciting plans for a trail but we can't say anything more at the moment (how mysterious is that?!). We'll be posting on the website and social posts as soon as we can, so keep an eye out and we look forward to welcoming you here soon.

CURIOUS CUISINE & REMEDIES FROM THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

Penguin Egg Pavlova

2 penguin egg whites ** 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
1 cup sugar 1 dessertspoon cornflour
1 teaspoon vinegar

Whisk egg whites until stiff, add sugar and continue whisking until firm. Add vinegar, vanilla and cornflour. Spoon onto greased paper that has a band of paper made into a ring for support. Place in a moderate oven for 15 minutes or until risen, then in a cooler over for 1 hour. Allow to cool slowly. Peel paper from sides and turn onto a plate. Cover with fresh whipped cream and decorate with fruit (fresh, or drained tinned fruit).

** 1 penguin egg equals 2 hen eggs

Thankfully, the custom of 'egging' (collecting birds' eggs for food) ceased long ago.

A Cough Cure

Slice an onion and put it in a shallow bowl, cover with 2 or 3 good tablespoons of brown sugar. Leave until the sugar has dissolved and mixed with the onion juice. Take 2 or 3 teaspoons before going to bed.

Cold in the Head or Headache

Mix 1 teaspoon of Worcester Sauce in a tumbler of soda water, drink while effervescing.

Remedy for Boils

Place 1 teaspoonful of gunpowder in a good thick fig. Eat one 3 times a day before meals till the boils disappear.

Spam

If you have an email address, you've likely received spam messages before. Spam email may come across as harmless, but these unsolicited messages sometimes attempt to steal your information, so read on.

Spam email, also known as junk mail, is unwanted or unsolicited messages that comes from mailing lists that you never signed up for. Spam messages may come from companies who are simply trying to advertise their products or services, but other spam messages are known as 'phishing' attacks. Phishing emails attempt to steal your information by appearing to come from a credible source, like your bank or an insurance company.

The origins of using the word "spam" to describe pesky messages came from a sketch in the TV show *Monty Python's Flying Circus* where Vikings chant about Spam, the brand name for canned, processed meat. Their chants in the sketch became so loud and repetitive that they muted any other conversations. Eventually, this sketch became synonymous with annoying messages, and "spam mail" was born.



The first known spam email sent was in 1978 advertising a new computer model. This spam effort reportedly earned the company \$13 million in sales.

Spammers may simply guess your email or scan the web looking for your email on line. Some spammers purchase email lists from other companies or services. It's important to check a website's privacy policy when you sign up for their emails to see what they may do with your email address.

If you think an email you've received is spam look for messages that say "Act Now" or "Limited Time Only" or is it too good to be true, Free money or a prize in a draw. If you are getting a great deal of spam messages, check your **Junk Email options and make sure** you choose the right filtering option for you. You can also click the option to report spam mail to Microsoft. Stay vigilant and if in doubt, trash it!
