

English Usage: a personal view by Michael Evans

Dictionaries and lexicographers

Dr Samuel Johnson's English Dictionary of 1755 was not the first one, but was the most comprehensive and influential for its time, with over 40,000 entries. It took him 7 years to get it published. He had a sense of humour, describing himself as "a harmless drudge."

Lexicographers have a never-ending task, since words continually change their meanings and new words are always being invented or imported. They can also risk the wrath of people who consider that words which are potentially obscene or fascist should not be included in a dictionary. Eric Partridge's dictionary of 1937 was banned from libraries because it included certain words beginning with c and f. Yet those words exist, and other racially sensitive words existed in the past. Who is to say whether they should be published in a dictionary? A lexicographer's life is not necessarily straightforward. When Webster's 1961 dictionary included a definition of "ain't" the row about it lasted for decades!



We are now into Autumn and the hot sunny days of summer are long past, although there have been a few warm ones. Sadly due to Storm Amy we had to postpone the Autumn Litter Pick for the safety of you all. The grey days are hard if you are unable to get out and about so please keep an eye out for your neighbours and make sure to have a chat, this can make all the difference.

We are delighted to welcome Councillor Tim Weaver following his co-option on to the Parish Council at our October meeting. This brings the Parish Council up to full membership and we look forward to his contribution to parish matters.

Sergeant Steven Payne and PCSO Adam Fitzwater attended the meeting in October. Sergeant Payne informed us that there had been 13 reported crimes in the last 90 days in Sturminster Marshall including tyre slashing, domestic incidents, shed burglary, criminal damage, public disorder, attempted burglaries, theft of a vehicle and damage to the SID. The team are very busy at present and this has been stretching them under present staffing levels but it is hoped that they will have an additional 5 Police Officers and 5 PCSOs by the end of March 2026 to help with the load.

The Clerk and a Councillor have met with a playground contractor regarding repairs identified in the recent Play Park inspection. The work required includes improvements to the surfacing in the high use areas and welding the fence. The War Memorial will be tidied ready for the Service for Remembrance Sunday on 9th November at 10.45am. We are also looking into adding another defibrillator to the Parish at Jubilee Cross, and we are currently investigating grant funding towards the costs. We have been discussing placing a Litter bin on Station Road but the costs involved are high and it was felt that for the moment it was better not to proceed with this. More responsibilities are being pushed down to the Parish Council and Parishioners by Dorset Council, and we have been informed that ditches in the Parish are now the responsibility of the adjacent land and home owners (e.g. Back Lane).

There have been issues with the company who were going to support and maintain the EV Charging points with getting cost-effective power to the sites. The company who are supplying the EV Chargers are going to take on that role temporarily until a solution is found. Once the legal side has been sorted we will be updated with the next steps. This project is wholly funded by Dorset Council through a central government grant and we are dependent on their processes

being concluded before we can move forward. Any money the Parish Council has spent on this has been from the grant we were awarded.

A Survey for 20mph speed limit will be sent out in November. I am sure I can hear you groan 'not another Survey' but this one is important, we need your views on whether we should proceed with trying to get a 20mph speed limit in the village so please do take part.

It is that time of year again when we will be looking at setting the budgets for the next financial year. This is a very important task as we need to make sure in these difficult times that we have enough funds for any projects, maintenance and unexpected costs. Councils are yet again experiencing big shortfalls and more responsibilities are being placed on Parish Councils.



Steamboat Willie

In 1928 Disney was facing ruin. He had just lost the rights to his popular creation, Oswald the Lucky Rabbit, and most of his staff had been poached in a corporate dispute.

Disheartened and running out of money, Disney got his animators to work up an idea he had at the back of his mind, a sympathetic mouse who navigates his way through a series of comic misadventures. The mouse was initially dubbed Mortimer until Disney's wife persuaded him to change it



to the less pompous-sounding "Mickey" instead and Mickey Mouse was born.

Disney could not persuade a distributor to release the first two silent Mickey Mouse cartoons they made, but then he had a brain wave. Inspired by a film with synchronised dialogue that had taken the US by storm in 1927, *The Jazz Singer*, he decided to craft a cartoon where the on-screen action was intricately synced with a musical score and sound effects.

Steamboat Willie premiered in New York in November 1928 and was an instant sensation: glowing reviews soon began appearing in the press and people flocked to see it. Its innovative animated storytelling thrilled audiences and Disney quickly capitalised on the character's popularity with more adventures, with Walt himself going on to provide the voice of Mickey.

Steamboat Willie's success ushered in a new era of cartoon storytelling. It set the stage for Walt Disney's domination of the medium, which would see Disney creating the Oscar-winning Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs in 1937. Many other films followed and I am sure most of us grew up with Disney whether it was cartoon, drama or documentary.

"Over the last few years, we have ventured into a lot of different fields," said Disney, reflecting on his expanding empire. "I only hope that we never lose sight of one thing, that it all started with a mouse."



NOT TOO LATE by Lys de Bray

November is a good planting-time for tulips because by this time in the gardening year the soil has cooled down, if it's too warm the bulbs will start into growth. Check bought or saved bulbs before you plant them, discarding any that are soft or have mould/mildew. Set them in the ground or container at about 4-5ins/12cm according to type. Tulips need a sunny place, free-draining soil/compost and extra grit. They come originally from Turkey and the Eastern Mediterranean and don't mind (average) winter cold but don't like shade or wet. You can have them in flower from March until mid-May, some are a dwarf 8 ins/20cm while others (later-blooming) are a stately 35ins/90cm. The colour range is amazing - big, bold shining flowers early in the year opening to the sun like brilliantly-coloured waterlilies in scarlet, orange, yellow, cream, white, pink, green, lilac, lavender, blue-mauve, dark crimson, bronze or nearblack The petals (tepals) can be striped or 'flamed', have contrasting edges, dark or differently-coloured centres which give wide-open flowers an exotic appearance. When they are closed the flowers are often goblet-shaped; but when the sun shines and the flowers open flat they can be several inches/centimetres across. There are 15 tulip groups and some can usually be found at a garden-centre, the keen gardener might like to order from a catalogue, which will have examples of all of them. Species tulips such as Greigii and Kaufmaniana can be left undisturbed in the ground where they will increase if conditions please them. When/if they begin to increase, lift them every other year after flowering and separate the bulbs, replanting immediately in a mix of equal parts of garden loam, leafmould and fine grit/coarse sand (never, ever builder's sand) Don't plant species tulips in containers because these don't take kindly to being dug up and replanted and (generally) will not then increase for some years. As with many plants and other things it is horses for courses! For most of the others you can either throw them on the compost heap after flowering or lift them when the leaves have died down. Don't try to grow the seeds of hybrid tulips, it would be a long wait for nothing because few or none will ever come true. If you are keeping them, allow the bulbs to ripen in a cold greenhouse or a dry well-lit potting shed. Spread them out and pick them over from time to time, gently removing dead foliage. Replant the largest bulbs and mark the place, grow the smaller bulbs on in a cold frame in large pots of the potting mix, partially sink these in the ground, label and date: water as needed, sparingly in summer. Tulips come in several un-tulip-like shapes - some are exactly like peonies, e.g. the lovely pink and white 'Angelique', some have 'petals' that are narrow, pointed and slightly twisted, e.g. the red and yellow species T acuminata which will come true from its seed, though you'll have to wait about four years to see the flowers. Others - in a range of colours - have delicate fringed edges to the petals. Tomorrow I hope to be planting the fringed yellow tulip 'Crispy Gold' with dwarf mixed wallflowers and forget-me-nots.
