

# From The Church Thoughts from the vicarage for May 2024

Dear Readers,

Why is it that when the house is full of chocolate all I want is a sweet?

I'm writing this just after Easter and the Vicarage is still littered with the remnants of Easter eggs from family and 'left over' chocolate eggs from church events, but I really don't fancy any chocolate.

What I really crave is a Liquorice Allsort!

However, instead of going out to buy some I thought I would talk about them instead.

Liquorice Allsorts have been around since 1899 and the story goes that one day Bassetts sent one of their salesmen, Charlie Thompson, from their factory in Sheffield to Leicester to demonstrate their newly manufactured liquorice sweets to a potential buyer. During the demonstration the salesman accidentally knocked over his box of samples on to the floor in front of the buyer. Seeing all the wonderful, colourful mix of sweets on the floor, the buyer asked Bassetts to produce just such an assortment for him to sell. What this became was the mix of sweets we now know as Liquorice Allsorts.

In the aftermath of Easter the disciples were left a bit like the box of liquorice samples upended on the floor. They were a bit of a 'hotch-potch' of people – fishermen, a tax collector, activists and others who we know little about, each with their own colourful personalities, good and bad traits, each with their complex layers of failures and doubts just like the diverse 'allsorts' in the box. While Jesus had been alive they had stayed in reasonable order because Jesus had made it so (like the box of sample sweets the salesman carried).

But when Jesus was arrested and crucified the disciples were scattered, and although after the Resurrection on Easter Day they regrouped in the upper room for a while, like the liquorice sweets being replaced in their sample box for the journey back to Bassetts, here they were after Jesus' Ascension back to heaven, feeling as if they had been poured out onto the floor all over again in a mess and a mix up.

But sometimes from what looks like chaos something wonderful begins.

The 'happy accident' of the salesman and his liquorice sweets became the well-loved box of Liquorice Allsorts that is still popular today, over 120 years later.

And the disciples?

Well, they went on to be filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (this year celebrated in our churches on 9th May) and started the Christian Church which shared the Good News of Jesus with all the world. The Christian Church is still sharing that Good News now, over 2000 years later and encouraging people, whoever they are, to follow in the way of life that Jesus demonstrated and to share God's love in the world.

Just like Jesus called a bunch of 'all sorts' to follow him and to build something wonderful to share God's love, God still calls all sorts of people to be part of the Church today, in their local churches, in villages, in towns and cities all over the world.

Whoever you are, whatever your past holds, whatever you look like, whatever age you are, you are welcome in God's Church because God loves all sorts!

### Nature's Voice

I'm reading a book at the moment which is all about fantastic creatures in our world. From Greenland sharks that can live for hundreds of years and keep their bodies from freezing by having high concentrations of urea in their blood to pangolins that can roll up like a ball with their baby snuggled inside with them, there are so many amazing and rare creatures in this book. The writer (Katherine Rundell) declares 'each single seahorse contains enough wonder to knock the whole of humanity off its feet, if we would but pay attention." She's right, of course, but, as always, I believe that wonder has to start at your own doorstep.

There're few things more completely amazing, when you only stop to think about it, than metamorphosis – the process some creatures undergo when changing from a larval to adult state – think Very Hungry Caterpillar! How on earth a squidgy grub only a mother could love can build itself a cocoon and change or pupate inside into a thing with wings is just alchemy!

I recently disturbed a pupa while weeding. I'd no idea what it had fallen from so my children 'rescued' it and popped it into a butterfly net to see what it became. The unassuming little brown capsule didn't take long to reveal its alter ego (burning an exit in the cocoon with special enzyme it produces) – a beautiful angel shades moth!

If you spend a bit of time looking at and looking after flying insects in all their states (as I've had to accept we do in our house!), you get your eye in and can see more and more of the grub's features that remain in the adult creature, their breathing holes or spiracles, for example, that are dotted along either side of both. You might think a pupa or cocoon is completely dormant and defenceless, but they can give the most impressive, grub-like wiggle, presumably to startle anything that might be about to eat it. Sometimes it is only the grub form that eats. Some moths and flies do not even have mouth parts, they exist in that form, purely to reproduce.

When we see butterflies, moths, flies and even beetles around us, it's easy to forget they were all, once upon a time, funny little grubs, like the ones you might come across when digging in the garden. They all, once stocked up on resources, spun a cocoon and waited for Nature to cast her spell, before emerging, quite literally, a new bug! So, appreciate the seahorses and the sharks, adore the pangolins and all the far flung marvels, but also remember the little miracles that are there for us to wonder at every day, if we just take a moment to look.



### What is Pentecost?

Pentecost, sometimes called Whitsun, which falls on 19th May this year, is celebrated by Christians, 50 days after Easter. It was when Jesus' disciples were given the power of the Holy Spirit.

But what is the Holy Spirit? This has been, for many, a difficult concept to grasp, and especially difficult for children. Sometimes it is portrayed as a dove but it is easier to explain by likening it to something we cannot see but know is there, such as air. What does air look like? Can you see air? It is impossible to describe air, but we can definitely see what it does. We need it to give our bodies oxygen and help everything function. We can also feel it, if the wind is blowing. We can see the wind bending trees outside, or creating ripples in water. But we can't actually see the air. We might hear it and sometimes a gentle breeze can bring us comfort or relief from a hot day. Air is essential to make a lot of things happen!

Well the Holy Spirit could be explained a bit like that. When the disciples were all together the bible tells us that they suddenly felt a rushing wind and tongues of fire landed on their heads. They were then filled with the Holy Spirit and were able to do amazing things through the power of the Holy Spirit! So like air, it is



also deemed to be essential to live life as a Christian. You can't see it but the Holy Spirit is often described as the active presence of God in the world and in the lives of believers.

Pentecost was really the start of the whole Christian church when God first sent the Holy Spirit to give comfort, help, and faith to his followers on earth.





### **Kingston Lacy Estate News**

### Eye Bridge management

We just wanted to give you an update on our plans for Eye Bridge this year. With all the recent rainfall the Eye Bridge area has been under water much more than normal. As a result of the changing weather conditions, and the ongoing popularity of the site we are needing to look at managing the site a little differently going forward. The overflow car park may have to have



seasonal opening due to the ground conditions or may have to open / close depending on the weather forecast. This will be trial and error this year to help manage the demand along with trying to conserve the wider area. We have already been in talks with the Council around ways to help manage traffic on the roads. Alongside these changes we are looking to improve our messaging and engagement with users of the site around the water quality and the amount of litter which is unfortunately left at the site. It is hoped that these changes will help visitors enjoy and respect the site for the benefit of nature and the local community.

### Thefts and vandalism

Unfortunately, we have been victim to theft and vandalism across the estate over the past few months. In September 2023 the Badbury Rings pay machine was ripped out of the ground and the new machine which has just been installed has already been damaged. Also, at Bishops Court Farm there have been a variety of thefts, and the cattle were released from the barns. All of these incidents have been reported to the police, but we just wanted to make you aware so that you can be vigilant of your own property and of any suspicious activity. If you see any crime, please report to Dorset Police (999 if a crime is in progress, or 111). The more crime that is reported the better the police can support the local area with patrols and investigations.

### Flooding....a warning!

The river has overflowed Mill Lane several times over this winter and each time there have been numbers of drivers risking driving through the flowing water. Sometimes a 4x4, ARV or large van has been followed by family saloon cars with very low freeboard expecting no trouble. Modern vehicles have undertrays beneath the engine compartment but this is not waterproof and only designed to protect the electrics from normal wet road spray. Any higher water will swamp the electrics which run the ignition and may short out the battery. Similar risks attend battery fittings in boot floors and the electrics attached...which could zero the engine management system. On three occasions over the winter cars have been marooned in the flood on Mill Lane and on at least one the occupants had to be rescued by the Fire Brigade.

Driving fast through floodwater heightens the risk as the bow-wave will ride even higher into the engine space.

If this happens to you your insurer is very unlikely to pay out on a claim for damage to your car, especially if you have ignored warning signs..... and they will not pay for your vehicle to be recovered from the water. We have no facilities in the village to recover vehicles and it will be up to you to remedy your problem....so remember that when you encounter flooding on Mill Lane or other places ...and find a diversion.

### Cowgrove Fruit Cake

This recipe is for a very easy, long lasting, moist fruit cake all put together in a saucepan.

4oz (125g) Margarine
6oz (175g) Granulated sugar
14oz (450g) Mixed Fruit
8 fluid oz Water
1 level teaspoon of Bicarbonate of soda
1 heaped teaspoon of Mixed spice
2 beaten eggs
4oz (125g) Self raising Flour
4oz (125g) Plain Flour
5mall pinch of Salt

In a large saucepan place the margarine, sugar, mixed fruit, bicarbonate of soda and mixed spice. Bring slowly to the boil on a medium heat, let simmer for 1-2 minutes.

Put to one side to cool.

Line a 7" square, or 8" round tin with greased, grease proof paper.

Add the beaten eggs, flour and salt to the <u>cooled</u> mixture in the saucepan, mix well.

Pour mixture into the prepared tin and bake in the centre of the oven on G as 4, 160 C (350 F) for 1 and a half hours or until the centre tests cooked with a skewer.

Allow to cool for 10 minutes before turning out on a tray to remove from the tin.





### Action Fraud issues a new warning to stay safe online after £1.3 million was lost from hacked email and social media account scams last year

Data from Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting service, shows that 22,530 people reported that their online accounts had been hacked in 2023, with victims losing a total of £1.3 million.

### Pauline Smith, Head of Action Fraud, said:

"Anyone with a social media or email account can be a target for fraudsters or cyberattacks. It is important to take action to secure your accounts, as fraud becomes even harder to detect with technology on a global scale.

"Protect your information by ensuring your email and social media passwords are secure and different from all your other passwords. You can also set up 2-step verification for a layer of extra security. Remember, prevent the potential for fraud and hacking, never share your password or any 2-step verification code with anyone."

In the reports made to Action Fraud, there were various different methods of hacking reported, including:

### On-platform chain hacking

This is when a fraudster gains control of an account and begins to impersonate the legitimate owner. The goal is to convince people to reveal authentication codes that are sent to them via text. Many victims of this type of hacking believe it's a friend messaging them, however the shared code was associated with their own account and the impersonator can now use it to access their account. Usually when an account is taken over, fraudsters monetise control of the account via the promotion of various fraudulent schemes, while impersonating the original account owner.

#### Leaked passwords and phishing

The other predominant method of hacking reported is leaked information used from data breaches, such as leaked passwords, or account details gained via phishing scams. This becomes prevalent as people often use the same password for multiple accounts.

### What can you do to avoid being a victim?

#### Use a strong and different password for your email and social media accounts.

Your email and social media passwords should be strong and different from all your other passwords. Combining three random words that each mean something to you is a great way to create a password that is easy to remember but hard to crack.

#### Turn on 2-Step Verification (2SV) for your email and social media accounts.

2-Step Verification (2SV) gives you twice the protection so even if cyber criminals have your password, they can't access your email or social media account. 2SV works by asking for more information to prove your identity. For example, getting a code sent to your phone when you sign in using a new device or change settings such as your password. You won't be asked for this every time you check your email or social media.

### Stakes and String for Safety - by Lys de Bray. (first published May 2011)

Now is the time (if not before now) to make sure that your taller plants in the borders don't fall over in wet and windy weather. There are many ways of propping things up, bamboo canes are very good and years ago I planted a lusty clump of bamboo to harvest these from. Newly cut, they'll be green, nicely matching the plant-stems. Mature canes fade to pale brown and then you can see them all too clearly. Always use a lot of canes for a substantial clump of delphiniums, heleniums, perennial sunflowers etc. as they need stronger support. Push the canes in round the edge of the clump (hammer in a pointed spike to make a hole) and run the first row of string about a foot (30cm) from the ground, looping and tying to each cane. Then add the second row at about the same distance and continue as needed.

I had some 8ft (2.4m) delphiniums some years back and I used thin, thin canes to tie at the backs of the heavy flower stems, having previously had my best ones snap in a rainy summer gale. Long and short-legged metal plant supports both curved and straight are very useful, peony rings are great for phlox, Shasta daisies and campanulas as the compartments keep the stems separate and if put in place at the right time they are almost invisible if they have been sprayed black, the green paint used for many garden products always looking unreal and artificial. At Wisley they have almost invisible plant supports, each large plant being given four wooden posts  $2" \times 2" \times 2$ ft ( $5 \text{cm} \times 5 \text{cm} \times 60 \text{cm}$ ) hammered in in a square. Stretched over the tops of the posts is strong black net, pulled tight and stapled in place. The holes in the net are about 2cm wide and permit upcoming leafy growth to pass through to be held firmly in place for the summer. The structure remains in place here throughout the year, though I imagine that at Wisley they remove them in the autumn, more full-time hands to the pumps there!

Another method of supporting growing plants is to use a number of twiggy branches (collected the previous autumn so that the leaves fall off). Good ones come from silver birch trees, but almost all leafy, branching shrub-prunings are good. The main stems should be sturdy, push them, upright, into the ground around the plant needing support. Where string is used choose natural colour brown, or use `bass' (raffia) but never, never nasty nylon which will cut the stems. For tall lilies give each stem a thin cane, placed at the back of the flower-stem. Large dahlias or similar you will have to get some stout posts, knock in three per plant. A big rain-wet dahlia lying on its side with flower stems all battered and broken is a sad sight, especially when you know that the sad sight is your fault.
