#### From The Church

Dear All,

#### A book review: Don't Forget We're Here Forever by Lamorna Ash

The outline is this; Lamorna is 28, Gen Z, she has started looking into Christianity. And she does so in depth – spending a year visiting various different churches of different denominations, doing a Christianity Explored course, retreating on lona, going to Quaker meetings, Orthodox services, reading the Bible in-depth, meeting and interviewing Christians at every stage and tradition – she looked at it all. Her only prior experience of Christianity was hymns from her Church of England school, and she jokingly wonders at the start if it's possible to become a Christian in a year. (*Spoiler alert, the answer is yes!*)

Lamorna questions everything, coming from a journalistic background, she doesn't take anything at face value, she reflects, wrestles, (and in fact Jacob wrestling with the angel is a key passage for her throughout), she has difficult yet honest conversations with people who are newly Christian, lifelong worshippers, and those who have left the church but not their faith. She reframes things that I hadn't noticed, or worse, had stopped noticing, such is the danger when you are immersed in the life of the Church. Mostly, she sees people of her generation yearning for meaning, for answers, for spirituality, for God.

It's a great read, but more than that it made me reflect hard on what it must be like to start coming to church for the very first time. If you've been to church for a long time then whilst every church does things slightly differently, you know that the general format and expectation is fairly similar. You could go to a different church one week and find yourself surrounded by the familiar prayers and hymns and readings. But if you've never gone to a service before then I imagine it could be very daunting, even in the friendliest of churches.

Ultimately, we come to church on a Sunday to encounter God, to worship God. We hear the words and stories of Jesus Christ and find in him hope, challenge, love, example. We experience the companionship of the Holy Spirit and of one another. We feel at home because we draw nearer to the kingdom of God when we join our worship with that of all the angels and archangels and saints that are in heaven. I would love as many people as possible to encounter God through our worship.

If you're reading this and are questioning whether or not church is the right thing for you, if you're wondering about God and faith and if there's something more, please take this as your sign to get in touch or come along. God is for everyone.

At the end of her journey and exploration into Christianity Lamorna writes this:

"I believe that the God of the religion which is my heritage might have come down to earth as a man 2000 years ago to walk alongside us and help us with our terrible pain because I can't think of a more beautiful story for how a god might behave."

How wonderful! We say the words of the creed, our statement of belief, each Sunday, but I could well imagine us saying this too – God came down to earth to walk alongside us and to help us with our terrible pain.

It's a very timely quote as we prepare again for Advent and Christmas, we get our hearts ready once more to receive the wonderful truth of the incarnation. Christmas is God setting the scene, coming down to earth to walk alongside us and to help us with our life and all it entails. Because Christmas is not about God in Jesus being born into a tidy world, or an easy world, or an ordered world or even a healthy world. This is not misguided trust, or blind hope, or meaningless love. Christmas is all about God in Jesus being born into a fragile and fractured world, a broken and breaking world, into a weary world which cannot save itself or heal itself. Christmas is about God in Jesus being born into a world desperately crying out for love. Christmas is God setting the scene, coming down to earth to walk alongside us and to help us with all that life brings.

If you are thinking or wondering about coming to church for the very first time this Christmas, we truly cannot wait to welcome you. If you know someone who is searching for meaning, invite them. If you know someone who is wondering about coming back to church, encourage them. If this is your 8th, 17th, 29th, 82nd Christmas, then how brilliant! And to all of you reading this, may you know the sheer beauty of God present with you this Advent and Christmas, and may you experience the love and peace of Jesus, now and always.







I know it is another survey, but we would really like to hear your views before making a final decision on whether to go ahead. As I write the weather is grey, overcast with heavy showers and a lot of wind which is certainly clearing the leaves off the trees. On walking round the village, I have noticed there are still hedges needing attention especially where they overhang the walkways and have large brambles sticking out. We discussed the Parish Council Budgets/Precept for 2026/27 in November, but it is not too late to let us have your suggestions on how the money should be spent. There is a lot of maintenance going on around the Parish. We are looking at repairing and replacing the surfaces below the play equipment. All other remedial work on the Playground has been completed. The Electrical Box in the Playpark is going to be removed, and the cable capped outside the playpark. The WI bench at Millmoor is being repaired. We are investigating assistance for replacing the Maypole, and we have a couple of possible avenues for the actual replacement pole which we are following up. The tidy up of the War Memorial area was completed in time for Remembrance Sunday, and it was good to see so much support on the day.

In the Dorset Council Newsletter there was mention of 'Help for pensioners this winter'. If you are a state age pensioner, you will most likely have received a letter regarding the winter fuel allowance for this year. #### Who Is Santa Claus?

Christmas celebrations are incomplete without Santa Claus. 'Santa Claus' is a bastardised version of the name 'Saint Nicholas.' The image that we are familiar with today was developed, surprisingly enough, by Coca-Cola in the 1930s.

St. Nicholas, also known as Santa Claus or Father Christmas, was the patron saint of children, prostitutes, and the poor. He is depicted as having a long beard and he wore a large cloak.



He was born during the

4th century in Patara, now in modern day Turkey, to wealthy Christian parents. After his parents died from an epidemic, Nicholas is said to have distributed their wealth to the poor. As bishop of Myra, he became famous for his charity and miracles. One well-known story tells of how he secretly threw bags of gold into a poor man's house at night to save his daughters from slavery and prostitution —legend has it the gold landed in their shoes or stockings.

This and many other tales sparked the tradition of gift-giving on December 6, his feast day, and ultimately inspired the modern figure of Santa Claus.

However, the origins of a Santa-like figure may be much older. Odin, the much-loved king of the Norse Gods was a bearded old man who was believed to leave gifts for children. He is usually depicted as an old man with a long white beard. He also had an eight-legged horse called Sleipnir. Odin would ride Sleipnir across the sky just as Santa does with his reindeer. Young children would fill their boots with straw and carrots during the winter and leave them by the door for Sleipnir to feed on. They would be rewarded with little gifts in their boots. This could be the true beginning of Santa Claus and the stockings that we leave out on Christmas Eve.

### **Kingston Lacy Estate News**

Here at Kingston Lacy, we never underestimate the privilege of looking after places as iconic as Badbury Rings. It's a site that draws people on lots of different levels: for a thousand years of history, for the colour of an orchid, for the sound of a skylark.

The Trust is a conservation charity, with nature conservation one of the key pillars of what we do. There are lots of different ways to support habitats that enable nature to thrive, and grazing with native cattle and sheep is one. Grazing different animals creates a mix of tall and short vegetation, where wild flowers can thrive and provide abundant nectar for butterflies and insects. It's particularly important on chalk grassland such as Badbury, which is a threatened and vulnerable habitat.

We need to increase livestock grazing at Badbury – not only in terms of the number of animals, but also the areas grazed. The aim is to mimic natural herd behaviour, where animals graze an area quite tightly for short periods before moving on. That means long rest periods for the grassland to recover, which leads to improved soil heath, greater grass resilience and better animal health.

So during autumn and winter (Sep-Feb) we will move animals around the ramparts using three different "compartments", created with electric fencing. It will mean a short period when you won't be able to circle the ramparts of the Iron Age fort, but the majority of the Rings will be accessible and you'll always be able to access the top of the fort as well as footpaths and bridleways. There'll be plenty of signs explaining where you can go, what we're doing and why. Dog walkers in particular will need to take care, both in terms of livestock during the winter and ground-nesting birds during the spring and summer, and will need to follow onsite signage regarding dogs on leads in certain areas and certain times of the year.

This is a long-term plan that will be repeated every year, and hopefully the increased birdsong and floral diversity will prove its worth at this unique and well-loved part of the Kingston Lacy estate.

### MY MOTHER by Lys de Bray


Stick it into the ground, water it in and forget about it. Most of the time she didn't know what the parent plant was, she just liked the look and colour of it and she often had to wait for years for the little plant grew to flowering size for it to be identified. Had she visited Kew in the days before the war she would have been in dire trouble; it wasn't the taking that motivated her, it was the desire to see if whatever it was would grow and flower for her and generally it did. There are some lucky people - obviously my mother was one, who have the greenest of green fingers or thumbs. Occasionally, and interestingly, you see the opposite.

I once had a handyman called Don who came regularly to sweep the paths, cut the grass, sort the garden rubbish and burn it, tie things up, cut things down and other essential but time- consuming jobs. A friend asked me to do a hundred rooted fuchsia cuttings for a special charity sale and I blithely said I would, thinking Don could do them, he'd watched me often enough. (No point in keeping a dog and barking too!) So I asked him if he'd like to do them and he seemed really keen, and got busy washing all the little pots while I went off to take the cuttings. I showed him again how to do it and left him to it.. That day I had visitors and didn't get to look at the cuttings until he evening and they seemed all right. But next day it was a different story. The cutting's leaves were limp and drooping while my own small batches were standing up smartly as usual. I left things as they were and got on with other jobs that needed jobbing.

First thing next morning I went straight down to the greenhouse. Don's cuttings had collapsed and lay looking as though they were gasping for air. Mine were as perkylooking as they usually were. I went off to see if there was enough material if Don's batch had completely failed and there was, just. What to do? Tell him or let him find them at whatever stage they were at? I thought it best to let him find them and be sad and surprised at that time. But I did wonder - I'd never seen almost total failure like this, though a few of his cuttings did seem to be recovering. Again, I left things as they were, though I checked that nothing needed watering.

Next day was one of Don's days and I started potting-on some other rooted cuttings as I wanted him to watch the next stage. He came to work as usual, said a brief 'Hallo' and went straight down to the potting sheds. There was a silence. Curious, I followed him. He was standing looking at his cuttings which were, if anything, paler and drooping even more and almost lying down.

I didn't say anything. What could I say? To see so quick a change in so short a time really surprised me. I'd never seen anything like it in my brief time of gardening and I wished I had somebody older and more knowledgeable to discuss it with, because it didn't seem normal to me. I'd taken a lot of cuttings and had never had any difficulty, none of them had ever drooped for longer than the short time that they usually do.
